4. SUCCESS! The response to the **A Promise of Hope and Healing** campaign was very overwhelming. We reached a pledge total of over **\$146,546** and over **\$142,573** has been received to date. This will surely help with the financial well-being of our spiritual home and I cannot thank you enough for your generosity. I am thanking God for the gift of you to our parish. Expect my thank you letter coming to your door with the great hope that it gets to your heart.

5. GENEROUS INDEED! God's immense generosity and perpetual providence is reflected in the hearts of our parishioners and friends. The **special collection** last Sunday for the victims of the super typhoon in the southern Philippines amounted to \$3,573.00. This is again **email phishing**, a fraudulent act pretending to be coming from me. **DO NOT RESPOND** to this email. Simply delete it and disregard it. But thank you for letting me know. I would say similar words that I received from a bank today: “If you receive a call or email asking you to provide any confidential information, do not engage. The bank will never ask to verify or divulge your personal information such as user account ID, password, account number, credit card number and CVV/CVC via email link, text message or phone call”

8. PRAYER! Tomorrow, January 22, 2022 is the anniversary of the Supreme Court decision, **Roe vs. Wade (1973)**, ruling that the [Constitution of the United States](#) protects a pregnant woman's liberty to choose to have an abortion without excessive government restriction. All Dioceses of the United States shall observe a “**day of prayer** for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion.”
