Things you may want to know this week

1. There were 53 young people who attended our **Youth Ministry** Relaunch/Kick-off last Sunday. It consisted of Get-to-Know and Community building games. It was a huge turnout and our youth director, **Travis Wingate** handled them so well with the help of his young adult friend, John Talay. The next meeting is scheduled on November 6 from 2-4p.m. at the Hennessy Hall.

2. Last Monday, I visited **Bishop Ignatius Wang** at Alma Via, an assisted living facility beside St. Thomas More Church in San Francisco. Bishop Wang is the former auxiliary bishop of San Francisco, and the first Asian-American and Chinese-American bishop in the United States. He stayed at Holy Name of Jesus, my former parish where I was pastor, for over 20 years. At **age 88**, he is still very sharp and prayerful.

A Solemn Vesper presided by Archbishop Cordileone was celebrated yesterday as the Archdiocese' way of honoring **Cardinal Robert McElroy** who was elevated to the rank of Cardinal in May this year. Cardinal McElroy is also a former auxiliary bishop of San Francisco prior to his appointment as Bishop of San Diego, a position he still holds to this day.

4. Last Wednesday, I visited the Second Harvest Food Distribution at Belle Air Elementary school. I was pleasantly surprised to see our 8th graders **Sabrina Sotomayor, Brooklyn Rose, Sophia Scardino and Reyna Quintana** helping in the sorting and distribution. Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers **Jeanie Munich, Eileen, and Jay Morena**, the site supervisor, were also there. Rick, a product of our RCIA and another parishioner Anna also came as volunteers. I am always inspired when I see people helping others.

5. Saint Vincent de Paul Society (SVdP) News:

- Our annual Thanksgiving Food Drive for the families they serve here in San Bruno. The Food Basket will be displayed at the Ambo beginning on Saturday, October 29. Items needed are canned fruit, pasta, cake mixes, cereals (regular size – not sugar coated), peanut butter (28 oz. or smaller), and jam (17 oz.). Lucky Script is also welcome. Your generosity will be greatly appreciated.

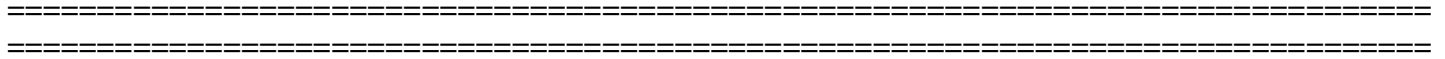
