## Things you may want to know this week

## 1. Archdiocesan Eucharist Congress:

- The priests in the Archdiocese of San Francisco regularly have a week for Retreat each year
  for our continuing priestly formation. In addition, we typically spend a few days for Study Days
  such as these past couple of days held at St. Mary's Cathedral focusing on the Eucharist in
  preparation for the upcoming Archdiocesan Eucharistic Congress that will be held in June this
  year.
