We sit together on our deck sipping our peppermint tea. We are warmed by the Autumn sun while breathing in the sweet fragrance of fallen leaves. God's peace surrounds us! We agree it is glorious to be alive at this time, in this place. Today we celebrate Respect Life Sunday. We ask ourselves: What does this day mean to us?

Jesus is with us throughout life at all its stages. He asks us to open our eyes to see Him in everyone who suffers. He wants us to reach out and help them—for it is in these precious children of God that Jesus lives!

Living the Liturgy

Today, we hear the third and last gospel passage about the vineyard. The reading from Isaiah and this gospel speak of bloodshed and violence, hardly what we would expect in a Sunday reading. But the parables are strong to get their point across: **some** of the Jewish leaders were not open to the prophets and are not open to Jesus, turning their backs on their heritage as the chosen people, refusing to listen to the promised Messiah who is in their midst. We need to recall the historical setting of this passage. Matthew and his community knew the hostility of some of the leaders and actual persecution. So their ire towards the leaders is expressed in this lightly veiled example. But we need to remember that just as God is always calling us, God also called the Jewish people and their leaders back to back to faithfulness. The covenant with the Jewish people stands, though they still await the Messiah. Our covenant is the "new covenant in my blood" as we hear every time we participate in the Eucharist. Jesus' life, death and resurrection has made us as well a chosen people. The Philippians reading tells us how to respond to such a gift: pray with thanksgiving; don't worry about anything; think about everything which is true, honorable, just, pure, lovely, and gracious. In other words, stay focused on your relationship with God and you will be at peace.

These may seem isolated and almost self-centered; it may be helpful to recall that immediately before this passage, Paul is warning them of false teachers who are preaching a worldly faith, focusing on the body and giving in to its every desire. And if we truly pray, we realize that we can never stay centered on ourselves; God always sends us out to be a loving presence for others. As St. Francis would say, Peace and all good to you! **S. Sheral**




ST. ROBERTS GROWNUPS COMMUNION LUNCHEON
