# Living the Liturgy

## God's Faithfulness

I've had two wonderful experiences last month. The first was the Jubilee Celebration of my Sisters who've spent 75, 70 and 65 years as Franciscans! Elizabeth has been a teacher and principal for years and more recently worked with seniors in an activities center. Marilyn was a nurse and founded our hospital in Santa Maria (whose board I sit on) and an adoption agency in Las Vegas through Catholic Charities. Norine taught Spanish for years, worked in Mexico with an intercultural exchange program for high school students and, more recently, at the reception desk for the hospital and as a tutor for employees wanting to learn English or Spanish. 210 years of faithful, loving service among them! I thought of all the changes they've seen in their lives in the community, in the Church and in society. And with God's help, they've grown and believed and changed. How blest we are to have many wise elders in this parish who have done the same! (By the way, I'm gone all this week at our every-four-years community meeting during which we set our direction for the next four years and elect our leaders.)

The other experience I had was the advocacy training sponsored by the Archdiocesan Office of Public Policy. There were nine of us there from the parish and an equal number from St. Dunstan's. We were born in Ireland, the Philippines, Brazil, Zimbabwe, St. Louis and the Bay Area. The evening began with a power walk, letting us experience how people in various personal, financial and job-related situations feel powerful or powerless. We then saw a fascinating video showing the reality of our global family in terms of age, religion, race and demographics. "If the world's population were reduced to 100, it would like something like this..." You can view it on your computer at [www.MinatureEarth.org](http://www.MinatureEarth.org). We reviewed a case study involving the mistreatment of widows in Zimbabwe. How amazing to have Zimbabweans present to give us the necessary cultural background to the situation! We discussed four bills pending on the state and federal levels and talked about the necessity of being politically active if we want our Catholic values to influence legislation.

Today is the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ and beginning this weekend, we'll be receiving Communion under both species again (for those who wish), holding hands at the Our Father, and greeting each other at the Sign of Peace in our usual ways. I offer just one simple thought on this major feast, an enduring sign of Jesus' faithfulness to the promise to be with us always. When we say "Amen," we are professing our faith in the presence of Christ in the Eucharist, but also in everyone we meet and in our global neighbors. May the Spirit of God grant us the grace to see the Lord in those we love and those we don't love as we ought and to act accordingly! Peace to you and yours. **Sr. Sheral**
