Dear Friends:

Then he asked them, "Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?" MK 4:40

FAITH, now there's a word I can relate to! I don't know when I started to truly understand what it meant to have faith, but I know I love sharing it with others. I notice it seems to be a media favorite too; even Oprah shares stories and lessons about *Living Your Best Life*. Faith for me has been that reliance on something other than myself to assist in fulfilling God's plan for me. Whether it be prayer, support from friends or even just quietly listening to God for an answer to my latest life challenge. God always has an answer – unfortunately sometimes the answer is NO.

Today's gospel is one I find comforting. It is reassuring to me to know that even the disciples, who spent days on end with Jesus in their sight, had trouble with their faith during times of storms. Our "life storms" seem to be less threatening than a storm at sea, but we deal with stormy times in our lives every day. How often are we challenged to keep our head amidst the chaos of real life? Do we remember to turn to Jesus and our faith at these times, or are we so focused on solving life's current storm that we forget - *God will provide a simple answer if we take the time to be still and ask for help?*

I offer you a challenge this week; it is one that I've offered to my students often. Choose one challenge in your life this week and GIVE IT TO GOD. That's right – let God take care of it! You may no longer think about it, plan to solve it or decide what needs to be said/done next. You need only to pray and wait for God to answer – BUT be sure you are ready to listen and HEAR the answer. Act only when you are ready to follow God's plan for your challenge.

Living the Liturgy

Ordinary Time

We'll no longer be singing the Gloria and the Our Father and you'll notice a shift in the readings and the songs. Remember that "ordinary" time doesn't mean dull and boring, but "counted," as in "ordinal" numbers. The weather should be lovely, and hopefully the more we enjoy it, the more it will remind us to thank its Creator! My sister has told me of parishioners where she is active in Missoula who "take the summer off" from Mass. We both thought that was so strange! If God forgot any of us for a moment, we'd cease to exist. No doubt, there may be parishioners working two jobs who find it almost impossible to come to Mass; the rest of us could pray twice as intensely on their behalf.

Did you happen to notice that the gospel for Trinity Sunday contained these very consoling words: "When they saw Jesus, they worshiped, but they doubted." Then he sends them out "to make disciples of all nations." In the midst of their doubts, they are commissioned to go forth, baptize and teach, and Jesus promises to be with them. They don't have to be perfect, or strong, or even ready to do what is asked of them! God will use us with our weaknesses and faults as instruments of his presence and his peace. The readings for today speak of God's power. In the book of Job, God chides him for expecting to be able to understand God's ways. Aren't we all tempted to do the same when we act as though God couldn't possibly be asking me to reach out to the colleague or neighbor no one cares for? God couldn't be asking me to get involved in something I feel totally unprepared for, but which needs to be done! God's ways really aren't our ways. Jesus' calming of the wind and sea expresses the power of God, filling the disciples with awe. What might he want to do in me, in my family, in my work situation? What has he already done in my life which demonstrates his power? May these summer days and nights open us up to reflect on the wonders God has done in our lives and will continue to do, if only we'll let the Spirit lead us. Peace, S. Sheral
