

LIVING THE LITURGY

"Be Reconciled to God"

Today's gospel, the Prodigal Son, is a familiar one to most of us. In the Tuesday morning reflection group, we talked about Henri Nouwen's book, *The Return of the Prodigal Son*. In it, he reflects on the Rembrandt painting capturing the moment of the younger son's return and his father's welcome in the sight of the older son, two men looking on and a woman faintly in the background, perhaps his wife. The book is a great one for Lent, inviting us to consider which aspects of ourselves resemble each of the three main characters. Some of us weren't wild enough to have been the younger son growing up, but many of us can identify with the older son in our resentment at God's goodness towards someone we think isn't "worthy!" Those of you who are parents or grandparents may have experienced the mercy of the father as you welcomed back into the family a child or grandchild who had gone astray. Nouwen's explanation of the deeper meanings in this family's relationships could give us insight into our own family dynamics. How loving are we? Is there someone to whom we need to show God's mercy? Is there need for reconciliation between myself and one of my relatives or coworkers? Am I willing to at least be open to the possibility of a better relationship?

And speaking of reconciliation, in the second reading, Paul reminds us, "Whoever is in Christ is a new creation." Are there aspects of my life which don't fit with my being a follower of Christ? If you want to celebrate the change of heart you're experiencing, you might want to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. You may call the rectory and set up an appointment with one of the priests or plan to come Monday evening, March 22 at 7:30 pm when we will host the parishes of the deanery for our Lenten Reconciliation Service. If you haven't been for a while, don't worry. The priest will gladly help you. Let us pray for each other these days and we all may be converted in those areas where we need to be!
