Dear Parishioners,

When I think of my Dad, many memories come to mind. He died 16 years ago May, but I often reflect on the gifts in my bones from his example. He loved to travel, having grown up in Roundup, Montana, a town of 1800 when he was young, now with only 1400 residents. His Dad had a general store in three small towns, called Marshall's Busy Corner, which sold "dry goods" as they called them then, implements and anything anyone in a farming community would need. When my Dad was growing up, he and his folks took a steamer to Hawaii and Egypt, but during the Depression, his father extended generous credit to everyone in town and they ate squirrels and gophers.

My Dad was honest to a fault. When he worked for Honeywell, he accidentally found out about another salesman's bid on a job. It was a moral question for him, discussed with my Mom, whether or not he could use that information to underbid the other offer. If any of the three of us kids got in trouble as school, Mom would announce at dinner: "Tell your father what you did."

We shyly did so and no matter what the offense was, he would reply, "You can do better than that." Those words were more effective than a spanking or being grounded could ever have been!

My Dad went to daily Mass when he could, especially during Lent. There was something magical about getting up earlier and walking with him to 6:30 am Mass at Sacred Heart Parish in Sacramento. He regularly wrote letters to the editor about situations he felt were unfair and was always happy when he received a reply, even if the letter wasn't published. The Klan was still active in Montana when he was growing up, so he was particularly concerned that members of minority groups would have equal opportunity to advance in education and employment. He was also thrilled to tell me that the chief engineer at Sutter Hospital was a woman!

When I went to the Holy Land in 1985, I had an experience which has stayed with me all these years. I was sitting on the shore of what we know as the Sea of Galilee when a family with two little ones arrived. The three year old went in wading and called out to her father, "Abba!" That's what Jesus meant, I said to myself! The word means "Daddy" and is a term of endearment, of tenderness. We are to be as trusting as a child, calling out when we need attention or help or just want to share something wonderful!

Some of us, no doubt, had terrific fathers and others, unfortunately, did not. But we all have this Abba, who will always love us as dearly beloved children, no matter our age or our faults. May all of us continue to reflect that Father's love to our Dads, our spouses, our children, and everyone we know. Happy Father's Day to all of you who bear that blessed title!

LIVING THE LITURGY

On Following Jesus

Every Tuesday evening, it's my task to take out the garbage. While doing that, I noticed that no one on our block had their recycling out, but I figured it had to be that week, since our bins were already filled to the brim. The other households must not have any recycling this time, I said to myself. Of course, I was wrong and it wasn't our week for the recycling pick-up. Afterwards, I thought about what had happened: my experience of our bins being full took precedence over what my eyes told me was reality! (Our bins were full because we had all been away at our annual community gathering the previous week when they were supposed to have been put out.)

Luke's gospel for this weekend has Jesus predicting his passion and death and plainly stating that if we wish to follow him, we must "deny [him]self, and take up [his] cross daily and follow me." The disciples do what I did: reality is being expressed to them, but their expected experience of a savior from the Roman occupation takes precedence over what he repeatedly says to them! How many times have we heard these words and we either ignore them or decide that they really don't apply to us? No one enjoys suffering, of course, but we adults all realize that it is part of life.

What would it mean for me to "deny myself" in 2010? Has self-centeredness crept into my life? Have I gotten into habits which aren't helpful to my relationships at home or at work? Am I so used to multi-tasking that I don't really pay attention to anyone or anything I'm doing? Do I ever take time to pray or to thank God for the gift of my life and the lives of those I love?

The reading from Galatians lists all the social divisions of Paul's time: "There is neither Jew nor Greek... slave nor free person, there is not male and female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus." Where am I in accepting people who are different from me? Is there a group against whom I harbor prejudice? How does that fit with my being a follower of Jesus?

I realize that this reflection may sound a bit as though it belongs in Lent, but the readings are challenging, so we can blame the Bishops Committee on the Liturgy who chose them years ago! Perhaps, you can take a bit of time to reflect on the readings, the citations of which are always in the bulletin. The Sunday readings are taken from the New American translation; the Jerusalem Bible is also a wonderful source for reflection. Blessings on your summer! **S. Sheral**
