Dear Parishioners,

Jesus' cautions against taking the first places at the table come immediately before his parable about a man who, when he gave a dinner and his invited guests refused to come, filled his table with poor, crippled, blind and lame people from the streets. The ending Luke gives this parable makes poor and chronically ill the privileged guests welcomed to share the host's abundance. He calls us to social justice as well as personal conversion. We are called to be humble and to defer to others. Spiritual leadership, which means taking on the humility of Christ and becoming a servant, is desperately needed in our own homes. It is certainly needed in our jobs, schools and churches. Suppose you have tickets to a play, the opera, a football game, or a race; however, these tickets don't put you as close as you want to be. Therefore, you seat yourself in the front row. When the usher comes and asks to see your ticket and takes you to the seats in the last row, you may be embarrassed. Go to the seat you are supposed to go to.

If you don't know, then ask the host or hostess where they would like for you to sit. If you don't know where God wants you to go, ask him and then listen for his answer. He will lead you to your own personal seat of distinction. When you judge others as being less worthy of heaven than you are, you may be surprised when God call them into his final banquet on resurrection day. You must keep focused on loving God with your whole body, mind and soul. And love others as God has loved you. Loving means forgiving as God has forgiven you. Say the Our Father and ask God to show you which way to go. He will lead you to the right banquets and the right seats. He will always lift you up if you ask him. He will sit in his great rocking chair in the sky. He loves you and wants you to sit on his lap when your resurrection day comes and rock with him for a while. Don't take your entry into heaven for granted. Remember to love God and others. Give to others without expecting anything in return.

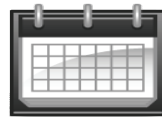
AIDS LUNCH –Sept. 8th

LIVING THE LITURGY

True Humility

Humility is the theme of both the first reading and today's gospel. It might conjure up an image of someone being a doormat for others. It comes from the word, *humus* which means "earth," so Sr. Barbara Reid reminds us "to be grounded, to be attentive to our connectedness ...with all persons, all earth's creatures and with God." (*Earthy Wisdom, America*, Aug. 29, 2010) In the gospel, Jesus eats again with unlikely people – this time the Pharisee and his invited guests. As Sr. Barbara writes, "By dining with those who opposed him [*in a major way, I hasten to add!*] he signals that their shared common humanity forged a connection that superseded their differences." As is the case today, meals were often a time to "show off" the illustrious people one knows and to cement tenuous relationships one wishes to cultivate. Jesus challenges this cultural norm. If you eat with those on the lower end of the social scale, you'll definitely have a different conversation than with those guests who are like you. Perhaps, you'll be invited to come up higher or, if not, you'll be stretched to find something in common with those whose lives are different from yours. Jesus presents a second challenge in talking about who should be on the guest list. You should invite those who have no resources with which to repay you. Is someone capable of giving, knowing the other can never return the favor? Are we?

Speaking of a meal, we've no doubt read about the huge increase in those frequenting food pantries and shelters. The homeless "regulars" have even less of a chance of finding a job with all sorts of highly qualified persons looking for work. We have two wonderful places nearby which feed the poor and could use your help. The San Bruno Catholic Worker on the St. Bruno Church property could use help from 5 pm to 7 pm preparing and serving dinner and visiting with the men who come to eat and for companionship. If you can help, please call Peter Stiehler at 291-2400 or e-mail him at peterstiehler@gmail.com. He'll get back to you promptly. You could also volunteer with Café St. Vincent in South City by calling Lisa at 589-9039. Their hours are 8 am to 12:30 pm; tasks include making sandwiches, doing dishes, serving and cleaning up. She could especially use someone with computer skills and the compassion to listen to those who come and need to share their stories.

May the Spirit open us up to share with those who can't repay us!
