Dear Parishioners,

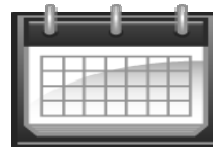
The readings this weekend seem all too real if we read the newspapers. Cholera in Haiti, flooding victims in Pakistan, terrorists in Yemen – this seems to be evidence of the end of the world. But in Mark's gospel, the community has Jesus saying "You never know when the hour will come." (13.23) Luke's gospel is written about 15 years after the destruction of the Temple, the center of Jewish worship, by the Romans. They also experienced the agonizing pains of becoming a community of both Jewish and Gentile Christians – think of many parishes who struggle to include newly arrived immigrants in their faith communities. Jesus is trying to prepare his followers for the same criticism and persecution which await him. If they act as he does, according to his Father's way of inclusion, they, too will suffer. They need to focus on him, trusting that he will be with them, as the Chilean miners did through their long ordeal. And they need to believe that "there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays." Jesus is that Son of Justice.

Each of us, no doubt, knows people who are suffering because of illness – their own or that of a loved one – or because of the financial strain of unemployment or family conflicts. At this stressful time in our society, probably just about everyone has a burden to carry, even those who give no outward sign of their difficulty. Are there small ways we can be supportive of these folks? While in line at the Seattle airport, I overheard a woman complaining to her friend about a first time flier whose confusion about the procedure slowed her down a bit. I was tempted to ask, "Haven't you ever done something for the first time yourself?" Why are we so impatient, myself included? On the other hand, I was impressed as I witnessed every single Western Washington University student who departed from the Bellingham, Washington city bus thanked the driver! Could we make a conscious effort to refuse to give in to negative or critical comments and, instead, add to the amount of goodness in the world?

The Franciscan Action Network www.franciscanaction.org proposes a commitment to civility in discourse which is especially timely after the election fracas we've endured. One of its points is the following: "Collaborate with others and recognize that all human engagement is an opportunity to promote peace." Blessings on your week!

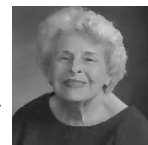
