## **Dear Parishioners,**



## **Year of Renewal in Worship and Prayer**

### **The Gloria / Glory to God**

Throughout the Christmas season we hear or sing the familiar carol: "Angels we have heard sweetly singing o'er the plains...." When we gather to celebrate the Eucharist on most Sundays and feasts, we echo the same song of the angels referenced in this Christmas carol, when we sing or recite together the Gloria (Glory to God).

The Gloria has often been called the "Angelic Hymn" because it opens with these words which, according to the Gospel of Luke, the angels sang at Bethlehem on the night of Christ's birth. It is one of the oldest Christian hymns, modeled after the psalms and canticles of the Old Testament. The ecstatic joy which the Gloria proclaims makes it suitable for all Sundays outside of the seasons of Advent and Lent and for all solemnities and feasts.

The Gloria concludes the Introductory Rites of the Eucharist, following the Act of Penitence when the assembly proclaims its faith in God who is loving and kind and the source of reconciliation and healing. It is fitting moment to turn to God to offer this ancient hymn of thanks and praise.
