

Dear Friends,

The rain has stopped and the sun is shining through the clouds. I sit here in Gene's big blue chair sipping Irish Breakfast tea. When I ask him to help me write this letter, I hear: "Open the little black Lenten book that Sister Sheral gave you." I open to the front of the book. At the start of Lent, I asked Jesus what He wanted me to write under "My Lenten Plan". There I had written: "Jesus says to me: 'I want you to be happy -- to enjoy the life I have blessed you with.'"

Both then and now, this seems an odd Lenten request. I say to Gene: "Shouldn't Lent be a time of grave thinking, introspection and sad thoughts?" In my heart, I hear Gene say: "Haven't you had enough of that? Remember how very much I enjoyed our life even during the hard times." What was Gene's secret? Could it be that he started each day by going to 8:30 Mass? Could it be that at daily Mass he either read aloud the Word of God or listened carefully to it? Could it be that, that through the years, he came to know Jesus? Could it be that he had a personal relationship with Jesus?

Memories fill my mind. I see Gene laughing as he swallows hundreds of chemo pills. I hear him joking with the wonderful gals at Mills Infusion Center as they tenderly give him blood transfusions. Gene and Father Bruce would tease each other about which of them had received the most units of blood. Gene's record was hard to beat – 81 units. Gene's favorite hours were when his children and grandchildren came to visit. Gene's most peaceful moments were when our great-grandson Chris snuggled in his arms. I would peek in and see them asleep together in this big blue chair.

Gene's twinkling blue eyes, infectious smile and jolly laugh are imprinted within my heart. Watching Gene's joy through good times and bad, have made me realize that God doesn't want us to be gloomy or downhearted during Lent or at any time in our lives. Jesus loves us so much that He died that we might live in joy, in peace and in harmony. His mercy and love embrace us and will remain with us for all eternity. So for my Lenten plan and for the rest of my days I will aim at following Gene's favorite motto:

LOVE LIFE – LIVE LOVE!



Living Liturgy

Water for Life

Interestingly enough, this Friday was World Water Day and today we hear the gospel of the Woman at the Well. There is an effort afoot to privatize water in developing countries, so the United Nations last year passed a resolution declaring that water is a human right. We can survive a long time without food, but not without water.

The thirst of the woman for physical water symbolizes her spiritual thirst, evident in her questioning of Jesus. She is no "shrinking violet," but someone who knows her faith and wants to figure out how this stranger, who breaks the cultural laws of the times, fits into what she already believes. He doesn't fit in, of course, but she isn't put off by that. Rather she is open to him, attracted by his words (and probably the quality of his presence) and willing to consider the amazing things he talks about. She goes to the townspeople, risking their derision, to tell of her encounter with him and she asks, "Could this be the Messiah?" Have we ever shared an experience of God's closeness with anyone? Might we do that sometime during Lent?

Do you recall our efforts two Lenten seasons ago to provide a PlayPump for a poor village in Malawi? I had asked for a photo once "our" pump was installed and never received one. By a bit of sleuthing online, I discovered that the company had been subsumed into a larger group called Water for People. Evidently, the PlayPumps people ran into problems: if there wasn't a school nearby, the women of the village felt silly riding the simple contraption pumping the water; some of the pumps broke down after a few years and/or didn't really meet the needs of the villagers. We should have received a letter informing us of what transpired and apologizing for the difficulties, but it never came. Water for People folks partner with local community leaders, non-governmental organizations and the local universities in Malawi, who decide which of the four types of latrines will best serve the people. They even have an entrepreneurial aspect to their efforts. A family buys a composting toilet with a loan from a sanitation entrepreneur who returns regularly to purchase, remove and sell the compost and through the exchange, the family pays off the cost of the toilet. WFP also trains local mechanics as circuit riders to maintain and repair the various types of water systems. They're online at www.waterforpeople. I sent a release to them for the use of our \$14,000. (It had been kept separately until then.) So your generous donation will still help a village in Malawi; it's just taking longer than we thought. I'll share their yearly report when I receive it.

You can help the world water crisis by drinking tap water and refilling a glass or metal bottle for your children. That will save all the energy and petroleum used in the manufacture of plastic bottles and the pollution from their transportation.
