Dear Parishioners,

Last week, we heard about Jesus teaching with authority, how he embodies God's desire for the world. This week in the gospel, we hear of the healing power of God working through his presence and touch. He first enters a home to heal Simon's mother-in-law, evidence that Simon (later called Peter) was married. Then he heals many of those brought to him who are ill or possessed by demons. (Commentators tell us that what was considered possession was most likely epilepsy.) There are many interesting facets to this passage. He didn't permit the demons "to speak because they knew him." Goodness always shines through and the goodness of Jesus was no exception! Very early in the morning, Jesus goes off to pray, before anyone else is up or needing his attention.

The disciples "pursued" him (as an animal would track prey, is the meaning in Greek), perhaps, wanting to share in the notoriety which his healings were bringing him. But he is ready to move on to other places and other people in need. And how about us? We can associate healing with members of the Charismatic movement or certain Protestant churches, but our Sacrament of the Sick is a celebration of the healing power of God made present through the priest and the community. The healing may be a physical one or an equally significant emotional one, freeing the person from undue anxiety or fear of death.

What kind of healing do I need? Which relationships may be strained or broken due to lack of attention or an old hurt which the other person has totally forgotten? May the Spirit open our hearts to the gift of healing today.
