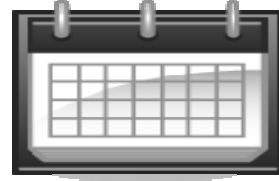

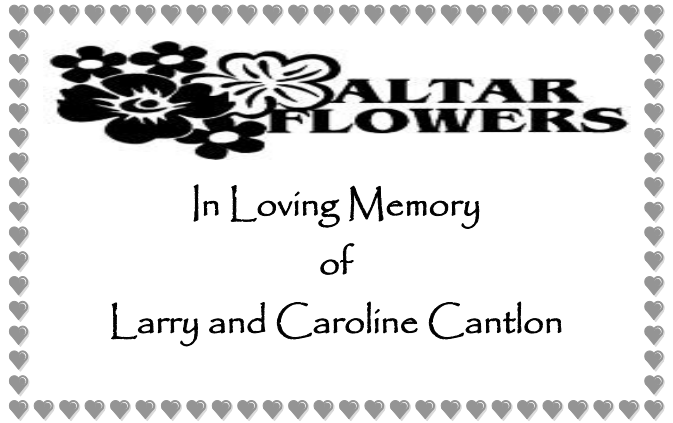

**Catholics and the Election**

Hilda Barradas, Arlo Uriarte, Mary Nunnery and I attended Bishop Robert McElroy's presentation at St. Dunstan's, "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship." He commented that we are "bifurcated" as Catholics since neither party includes all the principles we hold dear. He said that the Life and Dignity of the Human Person is pre-eminent and that one must also take into consideration the other six principles of Catholic social teaching. These were in the flier you received earlier from the Bishops' Conference, but here they are again: the Call to Family, Community and Participation; Rights and Responsibilities; Option for the Poor and Vulnerable; Dignity of Work and Rights of Workers; Solidarity; and Care for God's Creation. He spoke at length about the importance of following our well-informed conscience, one that has taken the Gospel and Catholic teaching seriously and prayerfully. He also suggested consulting with someone whose wisdom we trust, being careful not to choose a person we know will agree with us. May the Spirit guide each of us! S. Sheral
