Dear Parishioners,

November brings memories of our loved ones who have died, whose names surround us in church, who are already enjoying the kingdom of God. It's harvest time; thus, the pumpkins and gourds. The fruitfulness of the earth reminds us of the fruitfulness of their lives - in progeny and in works of mercy and love. They've been harvested home. They are the "great cloud of witnesses," our own saints.

The readings speak about giving our all, like the widow's donation of the last of her money. This passage precedes Jesus' first prediction of his passion, his giving of us all. The widow in the first reading trusts Elijah, using the last smidgen of her flour and oil to make him something to eat. He promises that God will supply her need and she, amazingly, believes him. Recalling that widows in those days were considered expendable and had no social standing, their great generosity is even more striking.

People's experience of Superstorm Sandy holds many lessons for those experiencing it and for the rest of us. There is great sadness, of course, for those who've lost loved ones and a sense of isolation for everyone cut off from communication with the outside world. We assume we'll have power, heat, light, gasoline for cars or generators. Does this experience cause them to be newly grateful for these basic services we can take for granted? How about us?

The blessing in this awful tragedy is that people have opened their homes to each other, have checked on elderly neighbors, and have shared the electricity they had. And in the process, whether on the giving end or the receiving end, they've discovered that we really are one family, regardless of our differences.

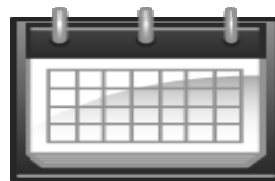
