Dear Parishioners,

Jesus' first disciples must have found his call to take up the cross challenging. They knew what crosses were, and would have had little desire to associate with someone predicting he would die on one, much less carry a cross themselves.

For us the cross is a revered symbol which inspires reverence more than fear. Yet, like those earlier Christians, we seek to understand Jesus' demands on us who wish to follow him. Jesus lays out three conditions of discipleship: deny yourself, take up the cross daily, and follow me. We tend to think of self-denial in negative and material terms - giving up pleasure or things we like or our special interests.

Jesus asks something more positive and deeper. He challenges us to reorient ourselves radically so that we are no longer the center. He calls us to think of others and God before ourselves.

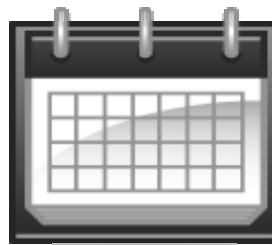
We may be put to death, but we need not look far to find contemporary disciples who have suffered discrimination, public scorn, and even imprisonment for their work on behalf of world peace, racial justice, economic justice for the poor, immigrants' rights, or the right to life of the unborn and condemned criminals.

Habitually thinking of others and of God before ourselves involved risk, but it is also an act of hope. Jesus does not require his disciples to undertake a suicide mission but invites them to follow him on a journey whose obstacles he will help them overcome. The way of the cross leads beyond rejection, suffering, and death to resurrection. Those whose lives are disrupted by the journey or lost for Jesus' sake will be raised with him into the new life of God's kingdom. God promises through the prophet a spirit of compassion for those who suffer.
