Dear Parishioners,

If you listened really carefully to the first reading, you noticed that it began, “The Lord appeared to Abraham...” and then describes the three men to whom Abraham is very hospitable. What he gives them is a feast by anyone’s calculations, and his promised reward is that in a year Sarah will have a son!

You’ll recall that in ancient times with few settlements, hospitality was an essential virtue: if travelers weren’t given water and some food, they would surely die. Hebrews 13.2 admonishes, “Remember always to welcome strangers, for by doing this, some people have entertained angels without knowing it.”

Jesus extends his presence and healing power to those outside the circle of his disciples and even to those outside the circle of his parents’ Jewish community. He restores to healthy the Syro-Phoenician woman and cures the Roman centurion’s servant. And as we heard last week, he praises the Samaritan who does what is right for the stranger who has been beaten.

The pending legislation on immigration invites us to look at those who are undocumented with the eyes of Jesus. Some of us are first generation citizens or permanent residents; others, second, third or fourth generation. We may claim that they came legally, but how much simpler it was to immigrate then! Many of our ancestors – Irish or not – came fleeing famine or war. Those coming today are often escaping the same tragedies. The North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) has wiped out subsistence Mexican farmers by flooding their markets with cheaper beans and grains. Go north or watch your family starve. Which choice would any of us make?

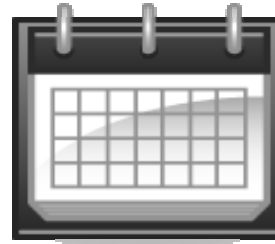
Although being in this country without documents is a misdemeanor (equal to driving without a license), 1100 people are deported daily, including some unaccompanied children. 3 million people whose only crime is being undocumented are also being incarcerated. Please take a postcard from the baskets at the church entrances and support the efforts of our bishops for comprehensive immigration reform. Thank you.
