Dear Parishioners,

Thanks for your prayers for a safe trip while I was away. We even got to see Pope Francis, along with 100,000 other people! He gives his Wednesday talk in Italian in St. Peter's Square, then priests give summaries in German, French, Polish, Spanish, English and Arabic. (The last language is a specific outreach to the Muslim community.) We also got to see those places around Rome which were important to St. Francis. We spent a week in Assisi, staying near St. Mary of the Angels, the basilica containing the tiny Portiuncula, the church Francis first worked on in response to the direction he received from God in a dream: "Repair my church." Much later did he realize that God didn't mean physical churches. Two of our sisters were present from all our provinces, so we were able to spend time getting to know Tanzanian, Indonesian, Brazilian, Dutch, Polish, Mexican and Guatemalan Franciscans.

Three of us North Americans and our two Sisters from Palenque, Chiapas then spent two more weeks visiting our Sisters in the Netherlands, Germany and Poland. Our particular Franciscan community was founded in Heythuysen, a tiny Dutch town, so we prayed in several places where our foundress grew up, worked as a sacristan, and began the first community of four women. Our German motherhouses are in Ludinghausen and Nonnenwerth, so we visited there as well. We spent a week in Warsaw and many smaller towns and heard stories of a repeated history of invasion and oppression by many neighboring countries. The Polish have only had 20 years of peace, between 1918 and 1938. We went to Auschwitz and prayed silently with so many other adults and young people. The shrines of Our Lady of Czestochowa and Blessed Faustina as well as the parish church of Blessed. Jerzy Popieluszko (and churches in Assisi and Rome) draw hundreds of people all day long – men and women, children, people of all ages. The Church is definitely alive and well, at least where we were.

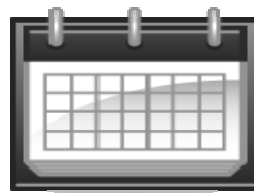

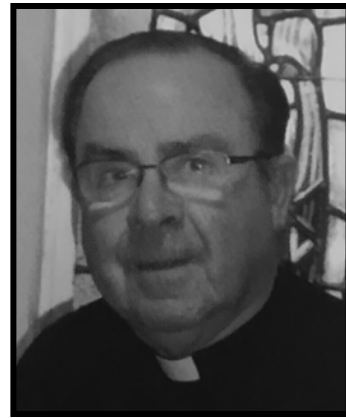
