Adult confirmation is available on an individual basis. Please contact the rectory to make arrangements.

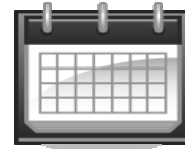

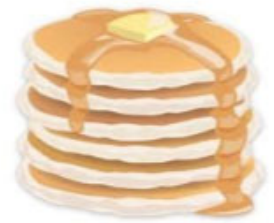
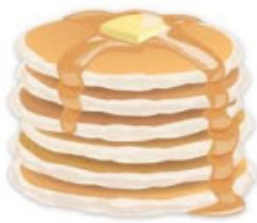
