## Dear Parishioners,

I'm happy to have another opportunity to thank you for your prayers, cards, gifts and the encouragement that you've been blessing me with for 16 years! Pentecost Sunday, two weeks ago, was a day I'll never forget. Thank you for your goodness. Thank you for truly being a loving community which cares about each other and "the least among us." Over the years, several of the adults who decided to become Catholic or to receive Confirmation have commented that they had been to many different parishes and found that ours was one they wanted to belong to because they felt welcome here. We are fortunate to have people of many ethnicities, diverse age groups, differing family configurations and various professions. We seem to have absorbed Jesus' practices of welcoming back those who have been away for a while and reaching out to those in need of healing from illness or losing a life partner. The kingdom of heaven is present in our parish!

Today is the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Mark's gospel tells of Jesus during the Passover meal, blessings, breaking bread and giving it to the disciples as he declares, "Take it; this is my body." Then he takes a cup, gives thanks and says, "This is my blood of the covenant which will be shed for many."

For us who are not Jewish, it may be helpful to recall two aspects of Jesus' action. The annual Passover celebrated God's deliverance of the Jews, then called Israelites, from slavery under the Egyptian Pharaoh through the crossing of the Red Sea (Exodus 14.15-15.1). Blood, symbolizing life, sealed the covenant, an agreement of faithfulness, between a community and its deity. We as Christians see Jesus giving of himself to the disciples - and us - as the symbol of his total self-giving on the cross. His blood poured out for us and the people of all times and places sets us free from slavery to sin and seals his covenant with us. He promises to be with us through the Spirit in a covenant that can never be broken, no matter what we do.


But we aren't just one with Jesus, but with everyone else who is partaking of the Body and Blood of the Lord. St. Paul gives an inspiring and challenging sense of what this means in 1 Corinthians 12. Lots of food for thought (and action) here!
