Dear Friends,

Golden leaves from Gene's crab apple tree surround me as I sip Vanilla Chai tea, here on our deck. Autumn has arrived! We find ourselves in the middle of October, the month in which we celebrate the Sanctity of Life at all its stages from conception until natural death.

Pope Francis has told us: ***"Every child who, rather than being born is condemned unjustly to being aborted, bears the face of Jesus Christ; bears the face of the Lord, who even before He was born and then just after birth, experienced the world's rejection. And every elderly person, even if he is ill or at the end of his days, bears the face of Christ. They cannot be discarded, as the 'culture of waste' suggests."*** (Speech to Catholic Healthcare Providers and Gynecologists, September 20, 2013)

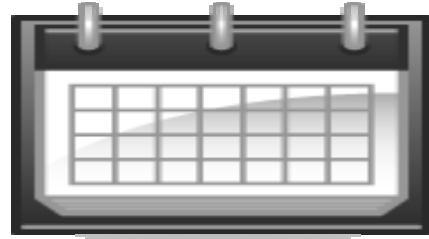
As Christians, we can no longer be "the silent majority". Now is the time for us to speak up, proclaiming that all life is sacred from the first moment of conception until natural death. How do we live out this truth: By encouraging, supporting and helping women who are in the midst of a difficult pregnancy; lovingly ministering to women who have had an abortion; giving to those who are poor, hungry or homeless; tenderly taking care of people who are ill, disabled, elderly or dying; urging our political leaders to listen to their consciences before making decisions on life issues, reminding them that only God has the authority to give life and to take it away. Together let us pray that each and every God-given life is respected, loved and protected.

Throughout life at all its stages – no matter how tiny we are; no matter how old – Jesus is with us. He asks us to open our eyes to see Him in everyone who suffers. His command is: ***"Love one another as I have loved you."*** His words mean that we are to respect each of them; defend and protect them; reach out to them and help them – for it is in these precious children of God that Jesus lives!

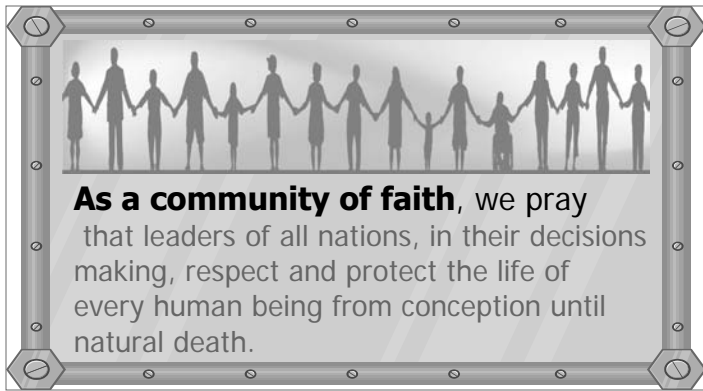
